he Parish is an ancient institution of the Church. Through the many ages the Parish Church has been tried and weathered many a storm to benefit the faithful Christians. The Parish is the ecclesiastical community gathered in one specific place. It is not the location or even to be considered a small part of the Church, IT IS THE CHURCH! For the Parish to be the Church, nothing should be lacking. Wherever the people of God are gathered with the priest, and the Holy Altar, the Church is present!

Every Orthodox Christian that belongs to his Parish, belongs to the Church; through his Parish he is united and participates in the Church. It is in the Parish that he is baptized, and his name is registered in the sacred registry of the Church. In these Parish registry books every child of Christian Orthodox parents is enrolled, keeping track of his birth, baptism, his marriage, and ultimately, recording the date of his repose. Reg-



istration in these books is a sacred practice that symbolizes our enrollment into the Heavenly Book of God.

We are all brothers and sisters in Christ, baptized in the same baptismal font through the Holy Sacrament of Baptism. We are all one body since we receive Holy Communion from the same Holy Chalice that unites us with Christ. We are all Parishioners of this Parish and yet, members of the greater Church.

For these reasons we should never separate ourselves from our Parish no matter what situation or reason may arise. Above all should be our regular participation in the Church Services. Our spiritual home is the Church of our Parish - our Annunciation Cathedral. Our spiritual father is our Parish priest who has the opportunity to know us by our participation in the Parish ministry. He is the one who enters our home in times of joy and sorrow, and we call upon him whenever the priest is needed. The Divine Liturgy is celebrated, as are all Church Services, for the spiritual well-being of pious Orthodox Christians, but especially for the faithful who live and dwell in this Parish!

We are all members of this Orthodox Christian Parish. By our own choice we have undertaken to become stewards of this Parish. We must have a positive sense of honor and benevolent ambition to strive to do our best for our Cathedral Parish. If we believe truly in the Church, we must love and care for our Cathedral Parish.

On September 7th, we will be welcoming His Eminence Metropolitan Constantine of Denver to preside over the Divine Liturgy for the Sunday before the Elevation of the Holy Cross. I pray that we will all be here to welcome him, as well as receive his archpastoral blessing.

As you well know, on October 2, 3, and 4 we will host our annual Greek Festival on the grounds of our Cathedral. We ask that you please participate and assist us so that we might be successful. The sharing of your time and talents – be it flipping souvlakia, serving food in the a la carte line or pastries, Greek dancing, or Cathedral tours – not only means you giving back of your gifts to God, but also sharing God's love with all our guests! People aren't just hungry for delicious food, they want to be connected to something deeper. Now more than ever, people are seeking community. Our Festival is the opportunity to not only open our grounds, but to open our hearts, to welcome in the stranger, and to greet them with Christ-like love. Every year people come to our Festival, then stay to become catechumens, eventually being received into the Church. The best way to preach the Gospel, is by living it in our own lives.

On behalf the Parish Council, we thank you for the love and support, spiritual and financial, that you have offered our Holy Church and our Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral. May the New Ecclesiastical Year be a time of prayer for the peace and salvation of our Parish, our Church, and the world.

The Metamorphosis of our Lord and our Salvation

he Feast of the Transfiguration is one of Orthodox Christianity's twelve major feasts, for it is when we commemorate and celebrate the most visible and dramatic manifestation of Jesus Christ's divinity and glory, second only to His Resurrection. All three Synoptic Gospels, Matthew, Mark, and Luke, report in remarkable similarity the metamorphosis, or the change in form, that Jesus undergoes on Mt. Tabor in the presence of the Apostles Peter, James, and John: "...and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light." (Matt. 17:2) The fullness of his Glory and radiance of the Triune Godhead, the uncreated light and energy flooded the mountaintop alarming the three apostles. At the same time, Moses and Elijah appeared in their glorified state talking with the Lord: "and behold, two men talked



with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure ["exodus" in Greek], which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem." (Luke 9:30-31) Finally, the greatest testimony of all as to Jesus' divinity and Sonship as Second Person of the Holy Trinity is God the Father's bearing witness from heaven declaring from the midst of a cloud that had come down and engulfed the whole mountain together with everyone present: "This is my Son, My Chosen; *listen* to him!" (Luke 9:35) Clearly, the Transfiguration is a Theophany and Epiphany revealing not only God, but especially Christ's divinity, through a dazzling, supernatural display of His divine, uncreated energy. The elements of light and a bright cloud, the white garments, and His face shining like the sun all point to Jesus' divinity. Furthermore, since God is Light ("This is the message which we have heard from him and declare to you, that God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all"—1John 1:5), and that Jesus Himself declared: "I am the light of the world..." (John 8:12); then, Christ is also God. Hence, we find in the Creed that He is "Light of Light, true God of true God!"

The importance for our salvation is not only the affirmation and confirmation that indeed Jesus Christ is God, but that He, having taken on fully our humanity yet at the same time retaining all of His divinity, and on his way to his "departure" (that is, to his self-sacrifice on the Cross and subsequent three-day Resurrection), united humanity to God; and, in so doing, deified us. Moreover, the presence of Moses and Elijah in their glorified state, Moses representing the Law and all those who have died; Elijah, the Prophets and all those alive in Christ (Elijah was taken up and therefore did not experience death), foreshadow our potential resurrection, deification, and glorified state. All of the latter gives us hope for our resurrection, deification and glorified state in the kingdom of God—it gives us hope for our salvation and eternal life with God. If we believe and have faith in Jesus, His Transfiguration and Resurrection, and we keep in mind what St. John wrote ("we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see him as He is" 1 John 3:2); then, we will be like Jesus on Mount Tabor, deified, in our glorified state, with Him for eternity. Just keep in mind that as St. Paul says if we lift from our face the veil of disbelief "beholding the glory of the Lord, we [are] transformed into the same image from glory, just in the Spirit of the Lord." (2Corinthians 3:18). In other words, our transformation, our transfiguration begins now by incorporating in our souls and our lives the Transfiguration of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as He Himself said "For indeed, the kingdom of God is within you" (Luke 17:21), if only we let Christ come inside us.

Celebrating 20 Years of Ministry of Fr. Michael Lambakis

On Sunday, May 25th, we celebrated the 20 years of ministry and service of our Rev. Fr. Michael Lambakis. Fr. Michael begins his new assignment as the Dean of Students at Hellenic College-Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in Brookline, Massachusetts. All those who study at HCHC will benefit from what we have received for almost two decades. This most important position will shape the next generation of priests and lay leaders who will serve our Lord and His Church in America.





LADIES PHILOPTOCHOS SOCIETY OF THE ANNUNCIATION GREEK ORTHODOX CATHEDRAL

The mission of Philoptochos is rooted in love and service. Whether we are welcoming a family seeking medical care, helping our youth grow in their faith, or supporting our seniors, the women of Philoptochos are living the Gospel every day.

In May, the Annunciation Philoptochos welcomed its newly elected board, a group of dedicated women committed to carrying forward the chapter's mission with energy and faith. Under the leadership of President Pauline Koinis, Vice Presidents Kris McGee, and Mary Gregory, Treasurer Frances Hadjigeorge, Assistant Treasurer Martha Stefanidakis and Secretary Stephanie Merlides-Kostef, the board will continue to strengthen existing ministries while exploring new ways to meet the needs of the parish and wider community. Their collective vision reflects the heart of Philoptochos — service grounded in love, fellowship, and faith in action.



The Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral Philoptochos in Houston lives out the spirit of philoxenia—hospitality and love for the stranger—through its Medical Philoxenia Ministry. This program provides housing, meals, transportation, translation services, legal aid, and emotional support to patients and their families who travel to Houston for treatment at the Texas Medical Center.

In 2025 alone, the ministry has assisted five families, including two adults and two children undergoing cancer treatment at MD Anderson, and another child treated at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston and Texas Children's Hospital in Houston. Depending on treatment, families may stay from one month to two years.

Beyond medical outreach, Annunciation Philoptochos invests in youth-oriented causes. Recent support includes hygiene kits assembled by GOYANS and then donated to IOCC, Paschal Passports for Sunday School, a Sunday School classroom smart board, assistance for Oratorical Festival participants, aid to the Texas A&M OCF chapter, scholarships for Greek School, and help with GOYAN Spring Retreat fees.

As part of the National Operation Classroom initiative—partnering with Houston's SEARCH homeless assistance agency—the chapter provided over two dozen children with full back-to-school kits, including backpacks, locks, calculators, binders, and supplies.

The Annunciation Philoptochos also nurtures the spiritual and social well-being of the Cathedral's elder members through its Senior Citizens Ministry. Under the guidance of Chair Maria Kantalis, this program offers regular luncheons and bingo, fostering connection and companionship, and ensuring that seniors remain active participants in parish life, valued for their wisdom, and supported in both their spiritual and personal needs.

Looking ahead, the Annunciation Philoptochos is preparing for a vibrant season of events that celebrate our heritage while sustaining our ministries. Plans are underway for the Original Greek Festival, the Cathedral's largest annual fundraiser; the Christmas Bake Sale, featuring holiday treats made with love; and the Festival of Tables, a cherished gathering that blends creativity, fellowship, and philanthropy. These and other events not only provide vital support for our philanthropic work but also strengthen the bonds of community within and beyond our parish. As we work to enhance, expand, and enrich our ministry, we warmly invite every member of our community to take part in this meaningful work.

Stewardship

As summer comes to a close and we prepare for the new ecclesiastical year, we wanted to take a moment to update everyone on the economic health of our parish and where we are through mid August.

First, we are deeply grateful for the generosity and commitment our community has shown so far in this year's stewardship campaign. Our goal is to raise \$1.9 million through stewardship to support the ministries and programs that serve our parish and extend Christ's love into the world. This amount not only supports those ministries, but covers maintenance, utilities, supplies, salaries, insurance and many other expenses needed to keep the Church functioning. But, stewardship only covers a portion of the overall budget of our parish. All in, our budget for 2025 is almost \$2.7 million. The difference between stewardship and this number is made up by such things as the festival and candles/trays.

To date, we have received \$1,677,120 in pledges. This is a tremendous blessing (and ahead of the same time period as last year), but we still have \$222,880 to go in order to reach our goal of \$1.9mm. This goal can be achieved with the help of 2 groups of families: those who have not yet pledged this year and those who have not increased their pledge in several years. Things like utilities must be paid first — which means the amount for ministries is what will be cut if we do not reach our goal. And, please remember, the governmental funds the parish received after Covid have been exhausted so it is 100% up to us to keep the Church going. For those who have not yet pledged, please take a moment and do it now.

We are encouraging our families to sponsor at least 1 day of the Church's expenses (\$7,000). But, of course, the pledge amount is up to you. Pledging now will enable your parish council to meet the Church's financial commitments for the year.

Second, there are a number of families whose pledge is the same amount today as it was 10 years ago --without an increase. A failure to increase a pledge over 10 years means one is actually cutting their pledge every year. Everything costs more today than 10 years ago. For example, a dozen eggs cost \$1.50 in 2015. Today, they cost \$6.30. Gasoline was \$2.50 in 2015 but is \$3.28 today. There are countless other such examples but the bottom line is that all of us pay more to live today than we did 10 years ago. Hopefully, many of us also earn more today. The Church is one of the centerpieces of our life so She should be treated at least as well as our other daily commitments.

If you have already made a pledge, we humbly ask you to consider **increasing your commitment** to help bridge the gap. We suggest a 10% increase if your pledge for 2025 is the same as last year. So, for example, if your pledge is \$1500, please consider increasing it by at least \$150. You can do that right now by emailing our administrator Myka Evans at mykaevans@agoc.org and indicate the amount of the increase.

Without meeting our goal, the very ministries and programs that bless our parish family—our youth and adult education, charitable outreach, worship life, and fellowship opportunities—will feel the impact. Together, we can ensure these vital offerings remain strong and vibrant.

Let us each do our part so that, united in faith and love, we will reach our goal and continue the work entrusted to us.

St. Efstathios the Great Martyr; His Wife, Theopiste; and their Two Children, Agapius and Theopistos

he holy Martyr Efstathios before his baptism was an illustrious Roman general named Placidas in the days of the Emperor Trajan. While hunting in the country one day, he was converted to the Faith of Christ through the apparition of an uncommonly majestic stag, between whose antlers he saw the Cross of Christ, and through which the Lord spoke to him with a human voice. Upon returning home, he learned that his wife Tatiana had also had a vision in which she was instructed to become a Christian. They sought out the Bishop of the Christians and were baptized, Placidas receiving the name Efstathios, and Tatiana the name Theopiste; their two sons were baptized Agapius and Theopistos. The family was then subjected to such trials as Job endured. Their servants died, all their goods were stolen, and on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem they were scattered abroad, each not even knowing if the others were still alive. By the providence of God, they were united again after many years, and returned to Rome in glory. Nevertheless, when they refused to sacrifice to the idols-a public sacrifice from which no Roman general could be absent-the Emperor Hadrian, who had succeeded Trajan, had them put into a large bronze device in the shape of a bull, which was heated with fire until they died. When their holy bodies were removed, they were found to be without harm. They suffered martyrdom about the year 126.



St. John the Evangelist and Theologian

John and his brother James were helping their father Zebedee with the fishing when the Savior called them to follow Him and become fishers of men. They immediately left everything to follow His heavenly teaching. Such was John's love of virginity and ascesis that, above all the disciples, he was worthy of the name of "virgin," and such his ardent love for Christ and irreproachable life that, among them all, he became the "beloved disciple." He was one of the three closest to the Savior, who ascended Mount Tabor with Him. John looked upon the Divinity shining in the body of Christ and heard the voice out of the cloud that said: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased; listen to Him" (Matthew 17:5). It was John, carried away by his love, who wanted to sit at the right hand of the Lord in His Kingdom (Matthew 20:21). At the Mystical Supper, the Lord placed him at His side, where he leaned on the breast of his beloved Master (John 13:23). When the Jews laid hold of Jesus, Saint John followed Him into the palace of the high priest (John 18:15). He alone remained with the Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross when the Savior was crucified. Seeing John standing by, Christ

said to His mother: "Woman, behold your son!" and to John: "Behold your mother!" From that hour, John took the Virgin Mary into his own home (John 19:27).

It was on the island of Patmos that John wrote the New Testament book known as the Apocalypse or Revelation. John saw Christ, having the appearance of a young man whose "face was like the sun shining in full strength." Reassuring John, who "fell at his feet as though dead," the Lord said: "Fear not; I am the First and the Last; I am He that Lives and was dead; and behold, I am alive forevermore and have the keys of Death and of Hell. Write the things that you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which shall be hereafter" (Revelation 1:17ff). Then in successive revelations John was shown what will happen at the end of time: the gathering strength of iniquity, the coming of the Antichrist, his warfare against the faithful and his final struggle against Christ who, in the end, will cast him forever into Hell with the Devil and his angels. It was also given him to see in his vision the violent upheavals that will take place in the world, the fiery end of all things, and the final triumph of the Son of man, the general Resurrection and the Last Judgment.

John was the only Disciple of Christ to not face martyrdom, but finally reposed in peace of old age.



With your stewardship – the offering of your time, talents, and treasures – we have the opportunity to carry out Christ's mission. Please save the date and join us for our Fall Parish Assembly on Sunday, November 2nd following the Divine Liturgy.

Let us take a moment to remember the words that are proclaimed on the Sunday of Orthodoxy (the First Sunday of Great Lent): "As the Prophets beheld; as the Apostles taught; as the Church received; as the Teachers dogmatized; as the Universe has agreed; as Grace has shone forth; as Truth has been proven; as Christ has rewarded. This is what we believe; this is what we declare; this is what we preach, Christ our true God, and we honor His Saints in words, in thought, in sacrifices, in churches, and in Icons. Christ, we worship as God and Master, and His Saints we honor as true servants of our same Lord, and accordingly we grant them veneration. This is the Faith of the Apostles! Our Cathedral Community has actively been answering this calling! In the past year, we've completed:

- New AC units in both the Martel Hall and Administrative Offices, as well as in the Festival Center
- Repaired and installed a new roof on the Boozalis Festival Center
- Repaired stucco on the colonnade of the main entrance of the Festival Center
- Painted the interior of the Polemanakos Building
- Installation of a new sound system in the S.P. Martel Hall and Caloudas Athletic Center
- Installation and update of phone system and security cameras
- Update Wifi routers and network throughout all Cathedral, Administrative, and Educational buildings
- Purchase and implementation of new Realm church community software
- Installation of a digital mixer on the Cathedral sound system
- The ongoing installation of the iconography in our Cathedral

Our Cathedral Community has stepped up to help many during times of need:

- \$30,000 to support our students at Hellenic College Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology (Raised at Fr. Michael's Farewell Dinner)
- \$13,000 to the Hill Country flood relief

Thank you for your continued support. Your stewardship and additional support continue to allow us to be a beacon of light to all of God's creation!


The AGOC Bookstore News

A NEW NAME, NEW LEADERSHIP, AND AN \$80,000 INVESTMENT IN OUR FUTURE!

Houston's AHEPA chapter, which celebrated its centennial in 2023, was recently renamed the Anthony Kouzounis Chapter #29, in tribute to the Past Supreme President who made Houston his adopted home. Carrying on Houston's tradition of AHEPA leadership, Chris Kaitson was recently elected to the office of Supreme President during the Order's Supreme Convention in Orlando.

Since its founding in 1922, AHEPA—the nation's largest and oldest Greek American organization—has been steadfast in advancing education, the Orthodox faith, and Hellenic heritage. Since its inception, the AHEPA 29 Educational Foundation has awarded

more than \$1,000,000 in scholarships. These scholarships ease the financial burden of higher education, empowering our youth to thrive, give back, and strengthen their connection to the Orthodox community.

On Sunday, August 3rd, the AHEPA Chapter 29 Educational Foundation proudly awarded over \$67,000 in scholarships to 45 students from the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral, supporting their undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate studies.

Fr. Efstratios presided over the ceremony, offering an inspiring message on AHEPA's mission, history, and commitment to education. He emphasized that this ministry is vital to the church and encouraged continued support, including **opportunities to create an endowment in a loved one's name** to fund future scholarships. Father then distributed the scholarships to each student, while recognizing the donors.

Since our reactivation in 2018, we have welcomed over 40 young women ages of 14–27 across the Houston area into our organization.

In the 2024–2025 year, we hosted our annual Breakfast with Santa Bake Sale in conjunction with the Daughters of Penelope's Breakfast with Santa. This initiative, supported by our AGOC community, helped us raise funds for the nonprofits Girls Inc. and Lifeline Hellas ($\Gamma\rho\alpha\mu\mu\dot{\eta}$ Z $\omega\dot{\eta}\varsigma$). We also hosted our Spring Floral Fundraiser to benefit the Houston-based Candelighters Childhood Cancer Alliance. Thanks to your participation, we were able to sponsor over 28 days worth of parking fees for families needing childhood cancer care in Houston.
